



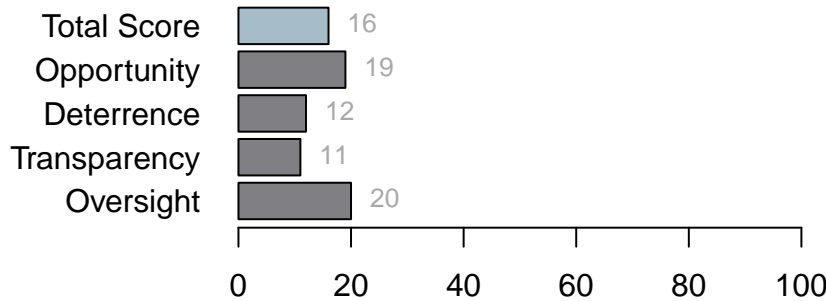
Australia

Overall Risk Score: 16

Risk Level: very low

This score is a composite of the four domain scores discussed below, which are weighted and combined to produce the overall country risk score. Each country is given a score from 1 to 100 for each domain and for the total bribery risk. A higher score indicates a higher risk of business bribery. Assessments of whether a given domain score is “good” or “poor” are made relative to all other jurisdictions within that domain.

- Business Interactions with Government:** Australia receives a very good score of 19 in this domain, based on a low degree of government interaction, a very low expectation of bribes, and a low regulatory burden.
- Anti-bribery Deterrence and Enforcement:** Australia receives a very good score of 12 in this domain, based on a high quality of anti-bribery dissuasion and a very high quality of anti-bribery enforcement.
- Government and Civil Service Transparency:** Australia receives a very good score of 11 in this domain, based on very good governmental transparency and very good transparency of financial interests.
- Capacity for Civil Society Oversight:** Australia receives a good score of 20 in this domain, based on a high degree of media freedom/quality and a high degree of civil society engagement.

This group is typified by stable democracy with strong civil society and large, highly developed economies.
