



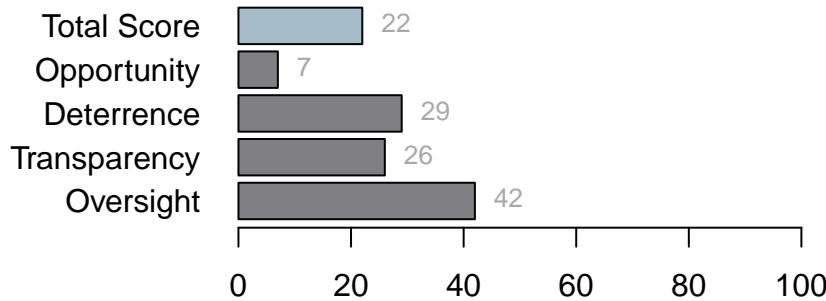
# Hong Kong

**Overall Risk Score: 22**

**Risk Level: low**

This score is a composite of the four domain scores discussed below, which are weighted and combined to produce the overall country risk score. Each country is given a score from 1 to 100 for each domain and for the total bribery risk. A higher score indicates a higher risk of business bribery. Assessments of whether a given domain score is “good” or “poor” are made relative to all other jurisdictions within that domain.

- Business Interactions with Government:** Hong Kong receives a very good score of 7 in this domain, based on a very low degree of government interaction, a low expectation of bribes, and a very low regulatory burden.
- Anti-bribery Deterrence and Enforcement:** Hong Kong receives a good score of 29 in this domain, based on a high quality of anti-bribery dissuasion and a high quality of anti-bribery enforcement.
- Government and Civil Service Transparency:** Hong Kong receives a good score of 26 in this domain, based on good governmental transparency and good transparency of financial interests.
- Capacity for Civil Society Oversight:** Hong Kong receives a medium score of 42 in this domain, based on a medium degree of media freedom/quality and a medium degree of civil society engagement.



## TRACE Bribery Risk Typology: Authoritarian with robust enforcement

This group may be described as having a less democratic form of government while maintaining an effective enforcement environment.
