



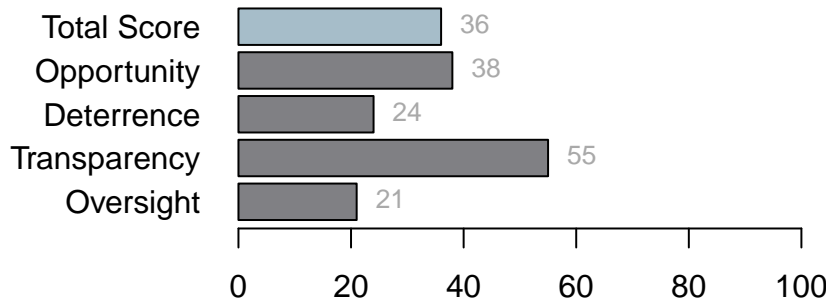

Overall Risk Score: 36

Risk Level: low

This score is a composite of the four domain scores discussed below, which are weighted and combined to produce the overall country risk score. Each country is given a score from 1 to 100 for each domain and for the total bribery risk. A higher score indicates a higher risk of business bribery. Assessments of whether a given domain score is “good” or “poor” are made relative to all other jurisdictions within that domain.

- Business Interactions with Government:** San Marino receives a medium score of 38 in this domain, based on a low degree of government interaction and a medium regulatory burden.
- Anti-bribery Deterrence and Enforcement:** San Marino receives a good score of 24 in this domain, based on a high quality of anti-bribery dissuasion and a high quality of anti-bribery enforcement.
- Government and Civil Service Transparency:** San Marino receives a medium score of 55 in this domain, based on good governmental transparency and poor transparency of financial interests.
- Capacity for Civil Society Oversight:** San Marino receives a good score of 21 in this domain, based on a high degree of media freedom/quality and a high degree of civil society engagement.



TRACE Bribery Risk Typology: Smaller democracy with strong civil society

This group can be described as democratic, stable states with strong civil society and smaller economies.
