



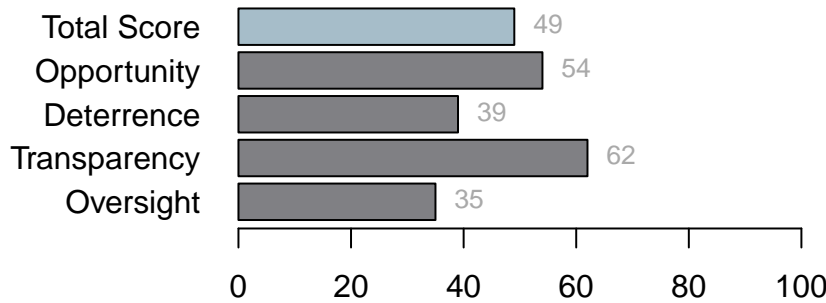
Solomon Islands

Overall Risk Score: 49

Risk Level: medium

This score is a composite of the four domain scores discussed below, which are weighted and combined to produce the overall country risk score. Each country is given a score from 1 to 100 for each domain and for the total bribery risk. A higher score indicates a higher risk of business bribery. Assessments of whether a given domain score is “good” or “poor” are made relative to all other jurisdictions within that domain.

- Business Interactions with Government:** The Solomon Islands receives a medium score of 54 in this domain, based on a medium degree of government interaction, a high expectation of bribes, and a medium regulatory burden.
- Anti-bribery Deterrence and Enforcement:** The Solomon Islands receives a medium score of 39 in this domain, based on a medium quality of anti-bribery dissuasion and a high quality of anti-bribery enforcement.
- Government and Civil Service Transparency:** The Solomon Islands receives a medium score of 62 in this domain, based on poor governmental transparency and medium transparency of financial interests.
- Capacity for Civil Society Oversight:** The Solomon Islands receives a medium score of 35 in this domain, based on a high degree of media freedom/quality and a medium degree of civil society engagement.



TRACE Bribery Risk Typology:

Democracy with simpler economy

This group is typified by stable democratic government and an economy largely built on the export of a limited number of simple products.
